

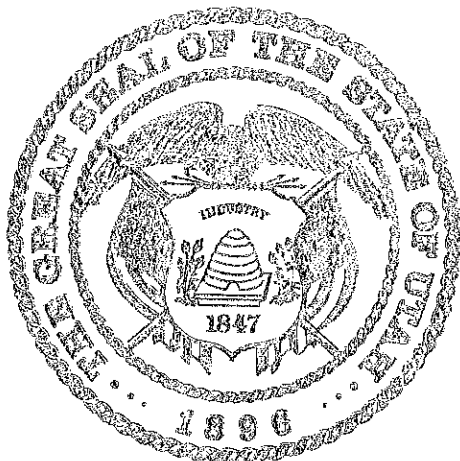

Dear Lt. Governor Cox:

As you may know the voters of Sunnyside City and East Carbon City have voted in favor of consolidating the two municipalities. Accordingly, accompanying this letter is a Notice of Impending Boundary Action as required by Utah Code § 10-2-610.

The cities are not aware of any other consolidation that has occurred in the state of Utah, nevertheless, the cities have worked hard to make sure all of the statutory requirements have been met. There are some areas of the process that are unclear, however, it appears that the consolidation becomes effective upon your issuance of a Certificate of Consolidation under § 10-2-611.

The cities hope to begin operating as a consolidated city as close as possible to January 1, 2014 to avoid any bookkeeping, taxation, or management problems that may arise from operating as two independent cities for a short period of time in 2014.

Dear Lt. Governor Cox:

Sunnyside Municipal Corporation and East Carbon Municipal Corporation of Carbon County, Utah have completed all requirements and received a favorable vote at election to consolidate municipalities. Accordingly, the municipalities are requesting a Certificate of Consolidation.

The name of the consolidated municipality is East Carbon – Sunnyside City.

The population of the consolidated municipality according to the Official 2010 Census of the United States Bureau of the Census is 1678. Accordingly, the consolidated municipality is a city of the fifth class (10-2-301, Utah Code).



Also attached is a copy of the consolidated city's approved final local entity plat prepared in accordance with Utah Code 17-23-20.




- Each city has passed a resolution which stated the intention and desire to consolidate.

- The Plan of Consolidation was made publically available.
- Notice of the Plan of Consolidation, the associated public hearing, and election were published pursuant to Utah Code.
- A Public Hearing was held on October 8, 2013 in which any interested person was heard on any aspect of the proposed consolidation.
- On November 5, 2013 an election was held with a majority of the registered voters in each municipality voting in favor of consolidation.

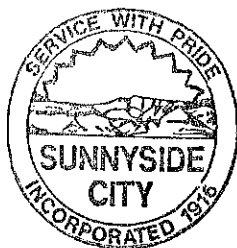

Re: Eligibility for Participation of a Newly Created Entity in the Utah State Retirement Systems

Dear Mayor LaFontaine and Mayor Parson:

When a governmental entity is being incorporated or created, Utah law requires the Utah State Retirement Office ("Office") to provide a letter to that entity identifying the potential provisions under Utah Code Title 49, Utah State Retirement and Insurance Benefit Act ("Retirement Act"), with which it shall comply. *See* Utah Code Ann. § 67-1a-6.5(3)(d). This letter serves as the official notice for East Carbon – Sunnyside City, a newly created city, formed from the consolidation of East Carbon City and Sunnyside City.

Based upon the information provided in your application, the Office has determined that East Carbon – Sunnyside City is an "employer" under the Retirement Act as a political subdivision of the state by virtue of its status as a city. Accordingly, East Carbon – Sunnyside City must comply with the participation requirements of the Retirement Act.

This does not mean that East Carbon – Sunnyside City must provide retirement benefits to its employees. However, at the present time and throughout the future, **East Carbon – Sunnyside City is required by law to participate with URS if and when it offers any type of retirement benefit to its employees.**

In addition, Participating Employers of URS are required by section 49-11-606 to "cover all employees eligible for service credit under this title." As such, if East Carbon – Sunnyside City continues to provide retirement benefits like East Carbon City and Sunnyside City have previously done, East Carbon – Sunnyside City will be required to cover all eligible employees, pursuant to the eligibility rules found in the Retirement Act.

Because both East Carbon City and Sunnyside City were already participating employers with the Utah Retirement Systems ("URS"), the Office will merge their accounts under the new name. All current and any future employees qualifying for membership in URS will be placed under the East Carbon – Sunnyside City account.

The qualifying public employees of East Carbon – Sunnyside City will be covered under either the Tier I or Tier II public employee retirement systems, as described in the Retirement Act. If East Carbon – Sunnyside City employs public safety or firefighter service employees, those employees will be covered under the separate Tier I or Tier II systems for public safety and/or firefighter service employees described in the Retirement Act.

Please note that the above-referenced laws are those used to determine eligibility for participation, and are not the only laws with which a participating employer must comply. Participating employers are required to "inform themselves of their rights and obligations" under Title 49 and should become familiar with all provisions of the Retirement Act. If East Carbon – Sunnyside City so desires, URS may provide additional education about the requirements with which East Carbon – Sunnyside City must comply as a participating employer.

Additionally, please be aware that should East Carbon – Sunnyside City fail to participate or fail to cover all eligible employees with URS while offering another retirement benefit to its employees, East Carbon – Sunnyside City's employees may have a claim against it for service credit under the Retirement Act, which the Office is required to enforce. Under the Retirement Act, such a claim would include all past employer contributions, interest, and in some cases, penalties. *See Utah Code Ann. § 49-11-601(3).*





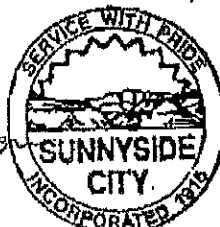

PLAN OF CONSOLIDATION FOR EAST CARBON CITY AND SUNNYSIDE CITY MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS

Sunnyside Municipal Corporation and East Carbon Municipal Corporation, in accordance with Utah Code section 10-2-603, hereby set forth the following plan of consolidation:

The areas to be consolidated into one municipality are as follows:

Sunnyside City

The entire area shall include the existing legally incorporated City limits of the City of Sunnyside as shown on the plat maps held at the Carbon County Recorder's office in Price, Utah. All properties which are not included in the legally incorporated City limits of the City of Sunnyside, Utah but are described in the deeds included with this document.

The population of Sunnyside City according to the Official 2010 Census of the United States Bureau of the Census is 377.

The name of the Consolidated Municipality shall be East Carbon - Sunnyside City.

Sunnyside City's Public Hearing on the question of Consolidation of the City of Sunnyside and the City of East Carbon into a consolidated municipality called East Carbon City will be held at Bruin Point Elementary on the 8th Day of October, 2013 at 6:30 PM. Any interested person may be heard on any aspect of the proposed consolidation.

East Carbon City

The entire area included in the existing legally incorporated City limits of the City of East Carbon as shown on the plat maps held at the Carbon County Recorder's office in Price, Utah. All properties which are not included in the legally incorporated City limits of the City of East Carbon, Utah but are described in the deeds included with this document.

The population of East Carbon City according to the Official 2010 Census of the United States Bureau of the Census is 1301.

The name of the Consolidated Municipality shall be East Carbon - Sunnyside City.

East Carbon City's Public Hearing on the question of Consolidation of the City of Sunnyside and the City of East Carbon into a consolidated municipality called East Carbon City will be held at Bruin Point Elementary on the 8th Day of October, 2013 at 6:30 PM. Any interested person may be heard on any aspect of the proposed consolidation.

According to Section 10-2-612 Utah Code, any consolidated municipality shall be deemed to be a continuation of the merged municipalities, except as herein expressly provided, and shall own all the assets, property, records, seals, equipment, and be responsible for the liabilities of each and all of the municipalities dissolved by the consolidation. The new municipality shall require the inhabitants of an original municipality included in the consolidation, by special tax levy, to satisfy any indebtedness incurred by the original municipalities, provided, inhabitants residing in other parts of the consolidated municipality did not or do not benefit by the revenue or services obtained by the expenditures causing the indebtedness. The governing body of the consolidated municipality shall be subject to the terms of the consolidation plan.

Each of the original municipality's existing bond debt obligations shall become obligations of the new consolidated municipality and shall be satisfied by the new consolidated municipality without special tax levy on the citizens of either original municipality. Further, the council of the consolidated municipality shall use best efforts to: 1) take advantage of economies of scale, 2) eliminate of duplication of services, property, and supplies, and 3) not increase the obligations of citizens to satisfy existing debts.

Pursuant to Section 10-2-605 Utah Code this plan shall be subordinate in all respects to the contract rights of all holders of any securities or obligations of the original municipalities outstanding at the effective date of the consolidation. This plan shall be subject to not creating an event of default with any lender, security holder, creditor, or contractor.

Section 3. Rights, Duties, and Obligations of the Consolidated Municipality of East Carbon City

Duties:

Employer:

To provide safe, healthy, clean, dependable, environmentally sound, friendly, courteous, and efficient services to the citizens of the new consolidated East Carbon City.

To provide a good working environment free from race, age, religious, or sexual harassment for the employees of the municipality.

To maintain and repair the water and wastewater systems of both former municipalities in the same manner as before consolidation and to provide to all citizens of the new consolidated municipality clean, safe, pure water and to dispose of wastewater in a safe, healthy, and efficient manner.

To maintain streets, sidewalks, and curb and gutter in a safe, healthy, and efficient manner. To plow snow when the weather warrants, and to clean and maintain storm drains to prevent flooding of streets and basements during inclement weather.

To provide trained, certified, efficient, friendly, courteous, and happy police officers, volunteer firemen, EMT's and ambulance drivers to respond to emergency situations and 911 calls from the citizens of East Carbon City.

To work to secure grants and other monies that will benefit the citizens of the consolidated municipality by providing better services and keeping costs down for services rendered.

To provide billing and collection services for the utilities provided to the citizens of the consolidated municipality. To collect overdue accounts on both utility and ambulance services provided through a bill collection agency.

To contract with a licensed attorney for City Attorney services and a licensed municipal auditor to provide CPA services as needed to assure that the City will remain in compliance with State Law.

To contract with a licensed engineering service to provide engineering services from time to time to complete projects that are relevant to the operation of the municipality, *i.e.*, water, wastewater, public safety buildings, etc.

Citizens:

To always obey the laws and ordinances of the city they reside in. To always obey traffic laws and speed limits and to be careful about how they travel inside the city limits. Safety should be the main concern, particularly where children are concerned.

To try to participate in the upkeep and beautification of the City where they reside. To provide a good atmosphere for the rearing of children and the enjoyment of family life. To strive to be an outstanding citizen by being seen and heard on issues that involve the betterment of our consolidated municipality.

To strive to always work out problems without getting angry and upset. To show appreciation for workers who are in difficult situations and who are doing their best to keep everyone happy. Find out the facts and act accordingly.

To show appreciation for the effort and energy spent by their City to provide a neat, clean, and beautiful place for them to reside. To also appreciate the neighbors they have and to do their best to get along with everyone in their City.

To do their best to keep their utility, ambulance, and other accounts with the City up to date and avoid late fees and penalties or shut off's of utility service.

Rights:

Employees:

To be covered by workers compensation, life, medical, and supplemental insurance which provides for the needs of the employee in the event of any incident that results from employment.

To maintain the level of insurance coverage enjoyed in the other employment situation. To be guaranteed in lieu of insurance payment if they received it from the former employment situation. This is only available to employees who are transferring from the former cities.

To be treated with respect and in a courteous, friendly manner, and to be given training for any position or job that they are appointed to fill before they are held responsible for the completion of that job.

To be protected by a working Personnel Policy which covers all aspects of the working environment, i.e., vacations, sick leave, maternity leave, bereavement leave, military leave, holidays, overtime, working conditions, etc.

To maintain all benefits as enjoyed in the prior employment situation with either of the entities making up this consolidated municipality.

Citizens:

To be part of the government of their consolidated municipality. To do their best to always work for what is best for the entire citizenry of the consolidated municipality and not just their own agenda. To attend City Council meetings and to be involved in the everyday workings of the City government.

To maintain their lots in a clean and safe manner and to obey all laws and ordinances pertaining thereto. To do their best to keep the City beautiful and clean including their lots and fence lines.

To travel only on designated streets, or trails and to maintain the speed limit. To always obey traffic signs and to always look out for children playing in the streets. Remember you are the only one who can prevent an accident if you are driving.

To act as though they are the ones responsible for the happenings in their neighborhoods. Not to just close their eyes and forget they saw it. To be a neighborhood watcher. To keep their eyes open and report any out of the way occurrences or events to the proper authorities. To always remember, they may be the one who saves the lives or property of someone they care about. To always be their brother's keeper.

Obligations:
