


CERTIFICATE OF DISSOLUTION

Pursuant to *Utah Code* 17B-1-217, we request that the following entity be dissolved:


Big Creek Water & Sewer Local District

Tooele, Utah 84074

The dissolution of the district is requested based upon the failure of the district, in response to a deficiency notice issued via certified letter from the Office of the Utah State Auditor, to provide a written certification 1) declaring that the district was and continues to be engaged in an activity, service, or duty listed below prior to the date of the deficiency notice, and 2) identifying the activity, service, or duty in which the local district is engaged.

- 1) Levying and collecting a tax;
- 2) Providing a commodity or service;
- 3) Collecting a fee or charging an assessment for a commodity, service, facility, or improvement provided by the local district;
- 4) Undertaking planning necessary for the provision of a commodity, service, facility, or improvement as reflected in a written study or report;
- 5) Acquiring or maintaining property or an easement necessary for a service, facility, or improvement to be provided by the local district in accordance with a general or master plan adopted by the district;
- 6) Constructing, installing, maintaining, owning, or operating infrastructure for the provision of a commodity, service, facility, or improvement, or
- 7) Legally incurring debt, contracting, or otherwise being obligated to provide a commodity, service, facility, or improvement within a reasonable period of time.
